They also appreciate the Lincoln Options Community Council's annual support of backpack and school supplies purchases for many of the students. We thank everyone who has contributed to supporting the modest salaries of the two librarians and the coordinator of the children's free lunch program, the college scholarships for Nicaraguan students, and the donations for the recent requests of sewing machines, school and office supplies, baseball gear.

We thank you for your support of our annual beat-the-winter-blues rummage sale in January and our perennial plant sale in May. We were able to respond to some direct requests for furniture and equipment for the People's Health Clinic (see page 11), and a large poured-in-place 15' reinforced concrete pedestal to support a large water tank to supply the baking school and other projects at the Escuela Hermandad.

Our all-volunteer organization seeks your generous financial support to maintain our annual commitment of \$16,000 to Santo Tomás, plus special projects that TSTSCA is asked to help make possible. Thank you again, for participating in this long-term relationship with our Nicaraguan friends.
